


Morin Book Day 2025

This term, British Science Week took place from March 7–16. The theme this year was focused on 'change and adaptation'.

During the course of the week, every child participated in a variety of science investigations based on this theme. Many exciting investigations took place during the week, ranging from observing 'water walking' to making pulleys. Year 6, particularly enjoyed investigating how the Peppered Moth has changed in colour over many years, adapting to the changing environment.

All of the children took their height measurements as part of a school-wide study, and the average height of a boy and a girl for each year was recorded and a paper cut out was made for each year showing the results.

A scientific showcase marked the end of this incredible week, during which all of the children celebrated the wonderful learning that had taken place throughout the school.
