The Government is continuing its drive to improve school attendance, making good school attendance a priority. The Government is placing more and more emphasis on parents ensuring their children attend school regularly and expects schools and Local Authorities to take ever more robust steps to reduce absence levels. This includes issuing Fixed Penalty Notices (FPN) for continuously condoned parental absence and the taking of holidays during term-time.

This causes a huge build-up of fumes for pedestrians and children walking past – this is hazardous to people's health so please turn off your engines whilst waiting to collect children.

## Young Voices at the O2



We joined with more than eight thousand other children to form a huge YV Choir and sang a fantastic selection of specially-written songs and medleys! This year, we were very lucky to be seated in a priority hospitality suite, which had comfortable seats and an excellent view of the stage (even if it was quite high!). Some of the other moments that made this year's concert memorable were singing 'Shackles (Praise You)', 'Something Inside So Strong' and 'It Must Be Love' with the special guest singers. The Choir were especially excited to sing 'Power in Me' – a Young Voices 'anthem' and a regular hit in our Music Assemblies in school. # Year Two News



The children also took part in three additional activities, one of which was a multi-sensory handling activity with 'Samuel Pepys', including exploring foods and spices of the period, looking at burnt materials, studying newspapers and a diary and grinding ingredients to make fake gunpowder.
