# **Diversity Council House Name Change!**

Following our big project to change some of our class names last year, The Diversity Council has been working hard on changing our House names too.

The children felt that although the previous House names – Scott, Shackleton, Cook and Franklin - tied in with the theme of 'discovery', they didn't represent our school community in terms of diversity and values.

As we have already changed our class names to more diverse people, the children wanted something completely different for our House names. First, The Diversity Council asked the children in their classes for ideas. The first list of ideas had 36 suggestions! Although they were great ideas it made it really difficult to choose. So the Council decided to choose some of their favourite ideas and ask the school to vote. Each class voted for their top three ideas, with first place being the idea to change our House names to gemstones:

Red - Garnet Blue - Topaz Yellow - Citrine Green – Peridot

The gemstones also link to our school values of perseverance, respect, friendship, kindness and honesty.

The next steps for the Diversity Council are to come up with ideas of how we can use our Houses more in school – not just for Sports Day and Assemblies.
