School meals:

Next week, we will be starting to re-introduce hot meals. This will be a very gradual process as the children cannot eat in mixed

year group 'bubbles' and must be forward facing when eating. Both of these protective measures have a significant impact on managing lunchtimes, both in terms of timing and space.

On Thursday 1st October, the children in Key Stage 2 will be able to purchase a hot 'take-away' meal which will be delivered to the classroom.

This will comprise of a sausage in a hot-dog roll, chips, carrot and cucumber sticks and a chocolate brownie. A vegetarian sausage option will also be available. The cost of the school dinner will be $\pounds 2.25$.

The children in Key Stage 1 and EYFS will have a special 'Teddy Bear Picnic' on this day. We will be writing to you with more details next week.

The following week we hope to be able to offer a hot 'take way' meal every Friday for all of the children.

In the week leading up to half term, we are aiming to trial a hot meal to be eaten in the hall on a rota basis throughout the week.

I am sure that you can imagine that this is a logistical challenge, but we will persevere in the hope of being able to offer hot meals each day during the winter months.
