

## Co-curricular music

All children from year 1 to 6 have the opportunity to learn a range of instruments as part of the school's co-curricular offer.

Lessons are delivered by independent peripatetic tutors and take place during the school day.

The tutors liaise with class teachers and rotate lesson times each term to avoid children missing the same subjects.

Children can choose to learn the piano, violin, electric guitar, clarinet, flute, cornet, trumpet, saxophone, classical guitar or continue with the ukulele.

Children can also learn to play as part of a band selecting either drums, keyboard, lead guitar, bass guitar or vocals.

Homework will be set on Purple Mash. Each child has a log in for this. They have used Purple Mash in school and lots of them are already confident with logging on.



- Continues Continues
- New books will be issued as soon as a child has finished their book.
- We expect children to remember to hand in their books and reading records every day but will prompt them to do this.
- We ask that children hand in their books every day, even if they haven't finished it so that we can monitor their reading.
- Once a child has finished the reading scheme, they become a 'Free-reader'. This means that they can select books from the book area to read at home. <u>Please continue to enjoy listening to your child read, even when they become</u> <u>a free reader!</u> Your child should discuss what they have read with their teacher who will then recommend some other titles to read.




- There are 36 high quality books in each class.
- The list of these books are on the school website and a list will be sent home.
- The aim is for children to read <u>30 books</u> to earn a <u>Gold</u> <u>Certificate.</u>
- If they read <u>20 books,</u> they can earn a <u>Silver Certificate.</u>
- If they read <u>10 books,</u> they can earn a <u>Bronze Certificate!</u>
- Children can read these books to you, and you can read them to your child.

Books can be taken home, but we ask that they are well looked after and returned! Teachers from each class will be monitoring which books are going home.
